Bikeway and Pedestrian Access Trail

The Sacramento Northern Bikeway Extension Project includes 1.8 miles of Class I Bikeway (12 foot wide paved bike trail) and landscape enhancements constructed within the former Sacramento Northern Railroad (SNRR) right-of-way.

This bikeway project begins at M Street in Rio Linda and extends north to the community of Elverta. The project was designed to avoid impacts to wetlands. Special features included the design of a 100 foot long bikeway pedestrian bridge to help preserve wetlands resources.

KASL and Sacramento County was awarded “Best Trail and Parkway Project” by the Sacramento Regional Chapter of the American Public Works Association in 2007 for project design excellence.

The scope of services provided by KASL included design surveys, base plans, coordination of permits, community outreach programs, preparation of alternative alignments for bicycle, pedestrian and multi-use trails, landscape irrigation, landscape planting, design of landscape facilities including rest stops, benches and drinking fountains, drainage studies and the preparation of construction documents.

Construction documents included improvement plans, special provisions and cost estimates. KASL also provided assistance to the County of Sacramento in project bidding and construction administration.
